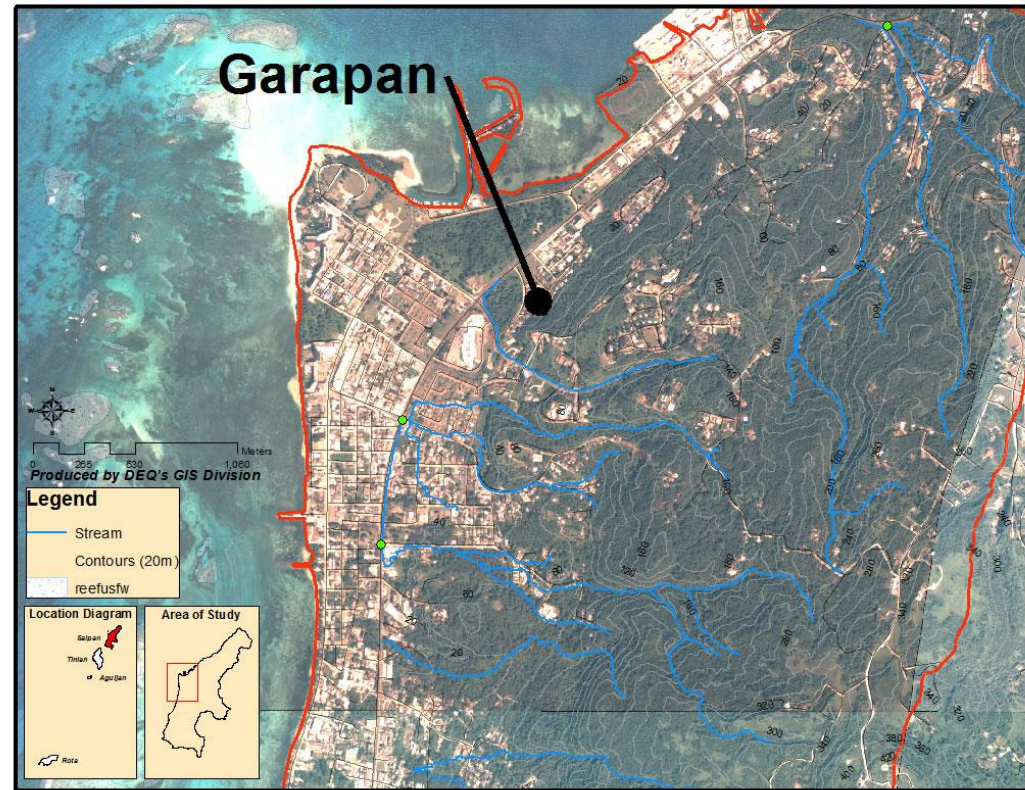
Garapan CAP

• Targets

- Wetlands and mangroves
- Urban greenspace
- Upland forests
- Turtles
- Fish
- Invertebrates
- Benthic habitat
- Beaches

• Potentially eliminate:

- Water Quality
- Historic Sites



Garapan CAP (cont'd)

- Threats (summarized)
 - Land-based pollution (affecting water quality)
 - Pesticides, agrochemicals, animal waste, sewage, sediment, trash
 - Recreational activities
 - Invasive species
 - Feral animals
 - Climate change
 - Directed hunting (sea turtles)
 - Local depletion? (fish/inverts)

Garapan CAP (cont'd)

- Strategies
 - Education and outreach
 - Regulations and enforcement
 - Engineering and infrastructure
 - Best Management Practices
 - Research and monitoring
 - Community stewardship and incentive programs
