WATERSHED PLANNING GROUP MISSION, OBJECTIVES, STRATEGIES, AND WORK TASKS

Determine Group Directions

- Develop interagency watershed group's identity through official CNMI and Federal designation.
- Generate ideas for resource use and development.
- Focus on problem watersheds.
- Prioritize watersheds for resource protection.
- Develop strategies to achieve objective goals.
- Utilize Soil and Water Conservation District expand Soil and Water Conservation District's role to include non-agriculture issues.

B.

- Provide Technical Assistance

 1. Provide guidance for total resource management.
- Share collective knowledge for decision makers.
- Support individual agency efforts.
- Provide collected resource information to agencies or groups for their use.
- Provide information on land development pressures for use by agencies.
- Identify resource considerations for infrastructure development.
- Delineate desired areas for preserves, parks, or temporary moratorium areas including connecting corridors between these.
- Adapt known resource information for geographic information system use.

Be Involved with Decision Making and Regulatory Changes

- Increase agency (inc. Federal) participation in permitting activities.
- Promote more coordinated project review procedures.
- Support development of CNMI's coastal nonpoint pollution plan.
- Develop ameliorative approach to const. watershed management.
- Develop resource protection strategies for incorporation into zoning standards.
- Assist in the protection of watershed resources with better water wellhead protection measures--incorporate into projects.
- Initiate legislative action for critical watershed protection.

D. Develop Specific Work Products

- Promote public education of watershed processes.
- Promote public education regarding effects of land clearings.
- Produce and atlas of CNMI island resources.
- Develop natural resource library for public or college library.
- Develop an on-island natural resources expertise roster.

Funding

- Assist in prioritizing grant dollar expenditures for infrastructure.
- Attract new grant dollars for watershed projects.
- Receive funds to implement (pooling of resources)
- Maximize use of limited funding dollars to eliminate duplication of effort.

 - Badlands Area






AMP Constructed Wetlands

Educational tool for school kids





Unified Watershed Assessment Watershed Categories

- Category I: Need restoration because they do not meet clean water or other natural resource goals
- Category II: Need preventative action to sustain water quality and ecosystems
- Category III: Pristine or sensitive watersheds on federal lands needing an extra measure of protection
- Category IV: Insufficient data to make an assessment
